Covid-19 Update

Most counties in the district are seeing very small increases in the number of new cases, with the exception of Chattahoochee County. Thirteen counties reported 10 or fewer new cases each. Eleven counties reported no new deaths; a total of 20 deaths were reported.

The cumulative number of reported cases in the West Central Health District is 59,885. The number of cases in the last two weeks is 355 with Chattahoochee County reporting the highest number, and Muscogee County reporting the second highest. The death toll from the virus currently stands at 1,333.

<u>Drive-thru Testing</u> is held at the Columbus Health Department lower parking lot, at 5601 Veterans Parkway. Days/hours are Monday through Saturday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. Pre-registration is not required at this location. Testing is also available at the Shirley B. Winston Recreation Center, 5025 Steam Mill Road, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Pre-registration for testing is strongly encouraged at the Recreation Center; please visit www.westcentralhealthdistrict.com to register, and for days and times at other health departments.

The number of residents fully vaccinated in our district is 160,779.

The CDC has recommended that the wait time to receive a vaccine be eliminated for anyone who received monoclonal antibody treatment. They may proceed with vaccination at their earliest opportunity.

Booster Doses

All three COVID vaccines – Pfizer, Moderna and Janssen – have been given EUA for *booster* doses for those 18 and older. The Pfizer vaccine has been given EUA for *booster* doses for those 12 and older. For those who received the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine, the booster shot should be at least five months after their initial series. All those who received the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine, booster shots are recommended to be given two or more months after their initial dose.

Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose, except for those under 18; Pfizer is the only brand that has been given EUA for boosters for this age group. Some people may prefer the vaccine type that they originally received and others may prefer to get a different brand.

Additional Doses for those Moderately or Severely Immunocompromised

The chart below shows dosing schedule for patients in these age groups. These persons may bring documentation from their healthcare provider, or self-attest on the immunization consent form as to their health status.

Vaccine Locations

The Columbus Health Department is giving all brands of vaccines inside the clinic Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm for those five years of age and older, at 5601 Veterans Parkway. Appointments are preferred, but not required. Please visit www.westcentralhealthdistrict.com to make an appointment and for schedules at other district health departments. Current CDC Prevention Guidance

The CDC recommends that all persons stay up to date on their vaccines and get tested if you are having symptoms. Other guidelines to stay healthy include:

- Wash your hands often for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Eat a healthy diet with plenty of fruits, vegetables, and lean meats.
- Exercise, sunshine (vitamin D), and supplements can help boost immunity. Check with a health care provider.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
