For chlamydia, the age-adjusted STD rate is 796.7 per 100,000 in Crisp County, 749.0 in The West Central Health District, and 615.2 in Georgia.  
For gonorrhea, the age-adjusted STD rate is 302.9 per 100,000 in Crisp County, 269.4 per 100,000 in the West Central Health District, and 208.4 per 100,000 in Georgia.

### Heart Disease

Rates 1.8X higher in males than in females; rates 1.3X higher in white males than in white females; rates 2.6X higher in black males than in black females



### Cancer

31.6% due to lung cancer; rates 2.0X higher in males than in females; rates 1.5X higher in white than in black; rates 2.1X higher in white males than in white females; rates 1.6X higher in black males than in black females



### Unintentional Injuries

Rates 1.9X higher in males than in females; rates 1.3X higher in white than in black; rates 1.4X higher in white males than in white females; rates 3.1X higher in black males than in black females

## Leading Causes of Death



### Cancer

40% due to lung cancer; rates 1.7X higher in females than in males; rates 1.7X higher in white males than in white females; rates 1.7X higher in black males than in black females



### COVID-19

Rates 1.8X higher in males than in females; rates 4X higher in black than in white



### Heart Disease

Rates 2.1X higher in males than in females; rates 1.6X higher in black than in white; rates 2.8X higher in black males than in black females
